The goal was to pray for students around the world who were persecuted. This year Compa campus ministry participated I.F.E.S. World Student Day on October 18th. Toronto, Canada, InterVarsity of USA in Colorado, and Campus Ministry Grand Valley State University in Grand Rapids, Michigan to send one-minute video greetings and a prayer request as well. James collected all the videos greetings and prayer requests. On October 18th. James led World Student Day in Querétaro, Mexico. James pasted ten different posters on a wall that had a country flag, the name of the campus ministry, and its prayer request. After he showed the collected videos. Students stoop up in front of the poster and prayed fervently for students around the world. 22 students and professionals gathered together to pray. The most common theme prayer was from Matthew 9:36-37, "Students are harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd...The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest. therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field." It's true in Querétaro. Here, there are more than 55 universities and about 300,000 are students. It's less than 3% are Christians. Still today students around the world are persecuted and mocked from their hostile cultures and societies and even from their families and friends for being a Christian. Fernando said, "Through social media we can share our prayer requests and carry other students' burdens on our shoulders. We can pray for one another even from a thousand miles away, but in the same Spirit." More than 13,000 students around the world joined World Student Day in prayers. Thus, the Spirit of the LORD has united students around the world through prayers. Please, continue to pray for persecuted students for the sake of the Good News and may the LORD send out workers into His campus.
