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Moreover, our partner COMPA campus ministry planned over a year ago to have their national students spiritual retreat from April 4th through 9th here in Queretaro. Due to COVID-19, the cancelled camp was changed to a two-day video conference April 6th and 7th. The virtual-online retreat continued through Facebook Live and Zoom meetings. We were asked to join with them in prayers that the Spirit of the Lord would direct and guide the spiritual retreat online since this was their first time. The theme remained the same: "Don't be afraid. We have hope." We studied the book of Revelation. I was asked to lead one of the Bible study groups. In my group, I had ten students, and two of them were from Brazil. We studied Revelation 3:12-20 and 4:1-11 for 75 minutes each day. All of the students expressed how they were encouraged and grateful to be part of God's covenant community through social media in the midst of adversity. Here is the report from COMPA:

- * 1,048 people participated the virtual-online retreat on Facebook.
- * 60 Bible study groups in the Zoom meeting were held for 650 people.
- * 50 leaders served at the two-days virtual-online retreat.

Thus, we can see how God is moving in the midst of the pandemic because together we were able to reach 1,048 people virtually, instead of just the 300 who were originally planning to attend the national camp.
